Jeffrey Mankoff

Jeffrey Mankoff, a specialist in Eurasian/Russian affairs, is an adjunct fellow for Russia studies at the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR). He is also associate director of International Security Studies, Yale University. Previously, he was a John M. Olin National Security fellow at Harvard University, and a fellow at Moscow State University.

Dr. Mankoff has written articles and op-eds on a range of topics connected to Russian foreign policy past and present, including continuity and change in the post-Soviet era, U.S.-Russian relations, the role of political parties, the Balkan crisis, and the diplomacy of Tsarist Russia. He is the author of *Russian Foreign Policy* (Rowman & Littlefield, 2009), a book on the evolution of Russian foreign policy in the Putin years. In addition to research, he teaches classes at Yale on modern diplomatic and military history.

He received his PhD in history at Yale in 2006, and also holds an MA in political science from Yale and a BA in international studies and Russian from the University of Oklahoma.
