

Thomas F. Cooley

Thomas F. Cooley is Richard R. West Dean and the Paganelli-Bull Professor of Economics at the New York University Stern School of Business, as well as a Professor of Economics in the NYU Faculty of Arts and Science. He was appointed Dean of NYU Stern in 2002. The former President of the Society for Economic Dynamics and a Fellow of the Econometric Society, Dr. Cooley has also received numerous awards for his teaching and is recognized as a national leader in both macroeconomic theory and business education.

Dr. Cooley joined NYU Stern in 1999 and has taught courses in macroeconomics and the international economy. He was named chairman of NYU Stern's economics department in September 2001, a position he held until being named dean. His primary research areas include macroeconomic theory, monetary theory and policy, and the financial behavior of firms. His research has been published in numerous journals including *The American Economic Review*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, *Review of Economic Dynamics*, *Journal of Political Economy*, and *Econometrica*. He is also the author of *Frontiers of Business Cycle Research*.

Before joining NYU Stern, Dr. Cooley served as Director of the Bradley Policy Research Center (1995-2000) and was Fred H. Gowen Professor of Economics at the University of Rochester (1992-2000). Earlier, he was professor of economics at University of Pennsylvania (1995-1997), professor of economics and applied statistics at the University of Rochester (1987-1992), and professor of economics at the University of California, Santa Barbara (1980-1987). Prior to his academic career, Dr. Cooley was a systems engineer for IBM Corporation.

Dr. Cooley received his bachelor of science from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and his master of arts and doctor of philosophy from the University of Pennsylvania. He also holds a doctorem honoris causa from the Stockholm School of Economics. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.
