

## **Price Fishback**

Price Fishback is the Frank and Clara Kramer Professor of Economics at the University of Arizona and a research associate with the National Bureau of Economic Research. He also serves as co-editor of *The Journal of Economic History*. He is a co-author of *Government and the American Economy—A New History*, published by the University of Chicago Press in Spring 2007. With funding from the National Science Foundation, he is working with Shawn Kantor and a series of co-authors on a series of articles examining the impact of Roosevelt's New Deal during the Great Depression. His 2000 book with Shawn Kantor on the origins of workers' compensation was awarded a Paul Samuelson Certificate of Excellence by the TIAA-CREF Institute and the Lester Prize by the Industrial Relations Group at Princeton University. Currently a Trustee of the Economic History Association, he was one of the organizers of the Cliometrics Conference between 1996 and 2008. His earlier research includes books and articles on labor market discrimination, segregated schools, workplace safety regulation, workers' compensation, wage compensation for accepting accident risks, coal miners, the operations of labor markets, interest group politics, strike activity, violence in strikes, and company towns. Price received his PhD in Economics at the University of Washington in 1983. After teaching at the University of Georgia and the University of Texas in the 1980s, he moved to the University of Arizona in 1990.
