

Nils Daulaire

Dr. Nils Daulaire is Distinguished Visiting Scholar at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and the Arctic University of Norway, where he teaches global health. He received his B.A. *summa cum laude* and M.D. from Harvard and his M.P.H. from Johns Hopkins.

He served in the Obama Administration as Assistant Secretary for Global Affairs at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and as the United States Representative on the Executive Board of the World Health Organization, after which he was global health security advisor to the Norwegian Institute of Public Health. In the Clinton Administration he served as Deputy Assistant Administrator for Policy at the U.S. Agency for International Development.

For over a decade, Dr. Daulaire was president and CEO of the Global Health Council, an international non-profit membership organization serving global health professionals. He devoted much of his early career working in community health programs in low income countries, including most of a decade in Nepal, where he conducted groundbreaking field research on community-based management of childhood pneumonia. He has worked in over 50 countries around the globe and speaks seven languages.

Dr. Daulaire is a member of the U.S. National Academy of Medicine as well as the Council on Foreign Relations.
